In her introductory remarks, Dr Adewara stated that the aim of Mobihealth is to provide millions of people especially in Africa timely access to medical experts worldwide via video consultations from the comfort of their home.

Basically, Mobihealth aims to “mobilise quality healthcare services to the door step of those who need it and when needed at a most time and cost-effective way possible”. It is set out to do this by connecting millions of Nigerians to medical physicians and experts across the globe within one minute via video or telephone consultation, and also setting up mobile

offices cross remote areas in the Nigeria without need for out-of-pocket payment.

The representatives gave a video presentations explaining their organisation's services followed by lively interactive sessions. In response to a question, Dr (Mrs) Funmi Adewara, pointed out that Mobihealth plans to introduce tele-medicine in Nigeria in the not too distant future.

The High Commissioner who was joined by a cross section of the Mission's staff commended the bold initiative being undertaken by Mobihealth to provide healthcare service across Africa.
